JUDGES PROFILES

Carol Moore BIS - Gadhelic

I have been associated with dog and livestock all my life but I began with Gordons in 1980 handling for a friend. My first Gordon Setter was purchased from the Carek kennels in 1985 and I have been on the show scene ever since. Although my affix of GADHELIC was acquired in 1987 I have only bred a few litters of Gordons, producing two Show Champions and a number of RCC winners, SH CM winners and Best Puppy winners. I have also owned and shown Labradors and currently have Field Spaniels who have won well at Open and Championship shows. I have attended and passed all KC exams that are required for judging and attended conformation & movement seminars. Also many breed specific seminars in the Gundog Group. I have stewarded regularly at Champ shows and had the honour of being Chief Steward for National Gundog Assoc. in 2000. I have served on many committees over the years and currently I am Chairman of the Setter and Pointer Club. My first appointment with tickets in Gordons was in 2007 at WKC and my first tickets in Fields was in 2017 at Darlington.

Amber Henshaw - Peteshe

I started out in dogs thanks to my grandparents; attending my first Crufts at the age of 2, making my first appearance in the show ring at 6. I have been extremely fortunate to have grown up amongst and be mentored by the 'greats' of the show world. In my early years I was heavily involved in Pekingese and Chihuahuas. Having worked up through the ranks and been a member of the Kennel Club back in the day, completing my 'apprenticeship' within the show world, I awarded my first set of CC's in Chihuahuas in 2019. DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.3rd August. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:- (1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F(1)19. (2) Transfer a. If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.b. For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height. c. For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.d. If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY- For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. PUPPY- For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. JUNIOR- For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. YEARLING-For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

GRADUATE-For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or

more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE-For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT-For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN-For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN-For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN-For dogs of 10 And over years.

SPECIAL CHAMPION-For dogs which have become a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club – dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

BRACE-For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace.

GOOD CITIZEN DOG SCHEME- For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above. **SHOW CERTIFICATE OF MERIT or SHOW CERTIFICATE OF EXCELLENCE**- For dogs which have been confirmed a Show Certificate of Merit or Show Certificate of Excellence winner - dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

SPECIAL WORKING GUNDOG- For dogs which have won prizes and awards in recognised competition at Gundog Working Test or having gained their Show Gundog Qualifier or a Gundog Working Certificate.

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER- For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by The Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant. Such breeds may be entered into Imported Breed Register classes and/or Any Variety or Stakes classes, with the exception of AVNSC classes, for which they are not eligible.

NATIVE VULNERABLE BREEDS- For gundog breeds as per Kennel Clubs yearly list.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 8.30 am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 9.30 am.
- 4. The show will be unbenched. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. The use of cooking stoves within the confines of the show is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.

- 7. Prize money on offer at this show is: BIS £20, RBIS £15, 3rd BIS £10, 4th BIS £5. BPIS £20, RBPIS £15, 3rd BPIS £10, 4th BPIS £5. BVIS £15, RBVIS £10. Best RBOBIS £15.
- 8. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 11. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has

competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.12. Best in Show The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register. Best of Breed - Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move.</u> This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 17. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and The Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 18. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 19. Not for Competition: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
