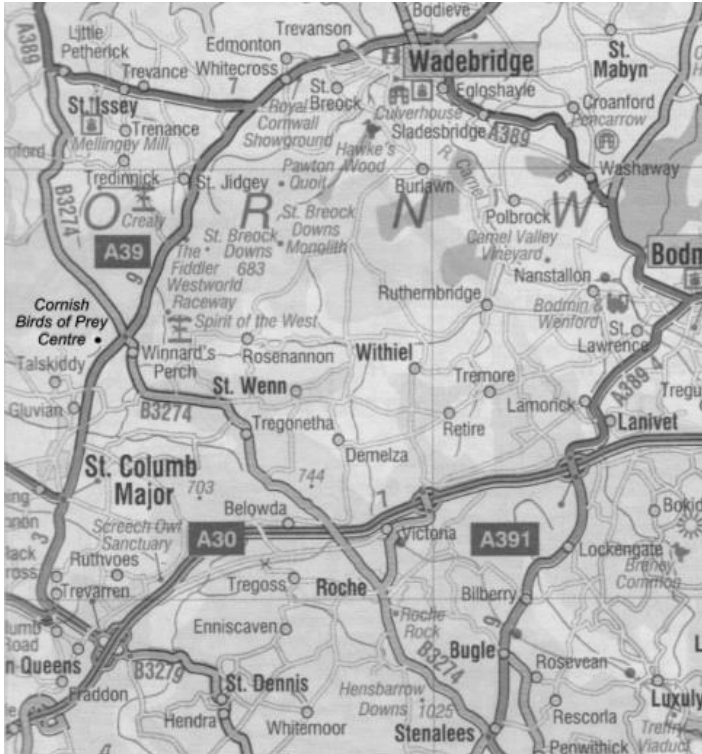

NEW VENUE - CORNISH BIRDS OF PREY CENTRE

Coming from the A30, follow the road to the Indian Queens exit. Exit left & follow the A39 to Winnard's Perch. The centre is on your left prior to Winnard's Perch roundabout.

For exhibitors from West Cornwall, exit left at Indian Queens & follow the A39 to Winnard's Perch.

For exhibitors wishing to exit the A30 at Launceston follow the A39 to the Royal Cornwall showground, carry on past the showground for approx. 10 minutes & you will arrive at Winnard's Perch with the Cornish Birds of Prey centre just past roundabout on your right.

JUDGES PROFILES – In alphabetical order

BRENDA HUTCHINSON – *Waverley*

I started showing in 1973 & my first invitation to judge came from Woolwich, Bexley & DCS in 1978. After 10 years of showing I first judged Golden Retrievers with CC's in 1988 & then Flat Coated Retrievers in 1990. I have been lucky enough to be asked to judge both Flatcoats & NSDTR at Crufts. Over the years I have worked on various committees, the Southern area of URC, on WB & DCA. I have done three stints on the committee Of the Southern Golden Retriever Society, most recently as Vice-Chairman. I am currently Chairman of the WB & DCA & President of the Southern Flatcoated Retriever Club. Judging has taken me across much of Europe & Canada to where it has been a privilege to meet the people & give an opinion on their dogs.

MARTYN REES – *Tyndale*

I am delighted to be coming back to this show & able to judge the Golden Retrievers this time. I started showing over 30 years ago. My interest in Gundogs started in the early 1990's. I showed my parents Flatcoat to his full title. I am passionate about the working side of Gundogs & my subsequent Flatcoats obtained their Show Gundog Working Certificate as well as their Stud Book numbers. Currently I own a working bred Golden Retriever whom I hope to compete at Field Trials in the future. I started judging towards the end of the 1990's & now award tickets in Flatcoats. Recently I have been judging other Gundog breeds at Open Level. I no longer exhibit but attend lots of Championship shows as a spectator. I particularly enjoy attending seminars & learning from the breed experts.

CAROL MOORE – *Gadhelic*

I have been involved with dogs & livestock all my life. In 1990 I showed a Gordon for a friend & purchased my first one in 1995 from the Carek Kennels. In 1987 I acquired my Gadhelic affix. From the few litters I have bred I have produced two Sh Ch's & a number of RCC's. I have owned & shown Labradors & Field Spaniels winning well at Open & Champ show level. I have passed the KC Requirements of a Dog Show Judge seminar. Attended the Conformation & Movement seminar twice. I have attended breed specific seminars for almost half the breeds in the Gundog group. I first stewarded in 1989 at Merseyside Gundog & in August 2000 was chief steward at National Gundog. I have been a committee member on various clubs from Open, Breed & Champ show level. I am Chairman of the Setter & Pointer Club. I have been judging Gundogs since 1989. I have judged the Gundog group & BIS at Open show level. I award CC's in Gordon Setters & Field Spaniels.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must be at the time of entry a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **3rd March 2020**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this regulation are:-

- 1: A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- 2: A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial class.
- 3: A dog in Any Variety Veteran class.
- 5: As provided in Kennel Club definitions of classes.
- 6: A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency Judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- 1: Withdrawal – The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- 2: Transfer:
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the

Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior Or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY – For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

PUPPY – For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

JUNIOR – For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

YEARLING – For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

GRADUATE – For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT – For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, **or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars**, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN – For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

VETERAN – For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.

SPECIAL VETERAN – For dogs of 7 to 9 years of age on the first day of the show – Classes 1 & 2.

SPECIAL VETERAN – For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the show – Class 3

BRACE OR TEAM – For two or more exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

JUNIOR HANDLING – A class judged on handling ability, restriction of entry by age of handler, dogs handled in this class to be entered in breed or AVNSC class at this show.

SPECIAL CHAMPION – For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion – dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

SHOW CERTIFICATE OF MERIT – For dogs which have been confirmed a Show Certificate of Merit winner – dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

GOOD CITIZEN SCHEME – For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze award or above.

SPECIAL WORKING GUNDOG – For dogs which have won prizes and awards in recognised competition at Gundog Working Test or have gained their Show Gundog Qualifier or a Gundog Working Certificate

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER - For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show /Best Puppy in Show as relevant

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1: The show will open at 8.30 am.
- 2: Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3: Judging will commence at 9.30 am.
- 4: The show will be unbenched. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5: The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6: Entry fees: Members - £3.00 - Non-Members - £4.50 per dog per class - Stakes Class - £3
Membership: Single £3.00 - Joint £4.00 – Junior £1.00 – Due 1st January annually.
Catalogues - £3 prepaid with entries - £3.50 on the day if available.

Advertisements - £5 full page & £3 half a page.

7: Prize money: Shirley Crisp Memorial Stakes Class 85 only, is: 1st £20 – 2nd £15 – 3rd 10 – 4th - £5

BIS - £20 RBIS - £15 3RD BIS - £10 4TH BIS £5 BPIS - £20 RBPIS - £15 3RD BPIS - £10 4TH BPIS £5 BVIS £15 RBVIS £10 Best Res BOB In Show £15

8: The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.

9: Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.

10: The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

11: BEST PUPPY IN SHOW – Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group, or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog, it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively.

a) **1:** Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.

b) **2:** Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.

c) Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best Puppy in breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety (Av) classes when judged before breed classes.

d) Proviso – For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Brace and Team or a Special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12: BEST IN SHOW - The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.a. Shows Judged on the Group System

(Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)

1) Best of Breed

Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

2) Best of Group

Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-

a) The Best of Breed winners in each group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs.

b) The best unbeaten winning dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.

3) Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.

b. Withdrawal from other Competition

Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group or Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Dogs may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before Breed Classes.

c. Proviso

For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14: No modification will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15: All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulations F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16: All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17: Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days: Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example, a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put as dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to refuse entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

18: Not for Competition. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

19: Exhibit numbers must be displayed on all cages and crates.

20: Except when securely benched or caged Dogs must be on a lead for the duration of the show including the exercise area, especially as this is a farm and there are sheep horses and cattle on the premises.

21: Exhibitors who bring children to the venue will be held totally responsible for any damage the Children do whilst at the show.

22. Any exhibitor whose cheque is not honoured by the Bank will also incur any additional charges the Bank may pass onto the Cornwall Gundog Club. Failure to pay these charges in full will be reported to the Kennel Club.

23. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

REGULATION FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1) These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited rule A 11.

a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.

b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations, then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 11.

2) a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show.

b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3) No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:

a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.

c) Operations to prevent breeding providing that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Not must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4) The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dogs or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club Limited in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

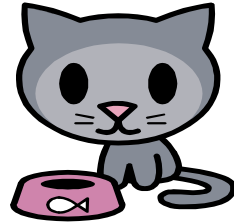
5) An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the

Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as Appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club Limited will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6) Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
