JUDGES PROFILES

JAN JANES BIS - Coedybrain

I came into dogs in 1975 when I purchased an Irish Setter as a pet. Shortly afterwards I purchased my first Welsh Springer Spaniel as a companion. I attended a local agricultural show as a spectator and was bitten by the show bug. I quickly realised that my original dogs were not of show standard. My first Welsh, of Dalati breeding, arrived in 1978 and I was well and truly "involved". My first litter of Welsh was born in 1979 and a bitch from this litter went on to win one CC and two RCC's. I showed Irish Setters for several years with some success then in 1987 visited the Wainfelin kennel and fell in love with a puppy who went on to become Sh Ch Wainfelin Chantilly Lace. Next came Sh Ch Coedybrain Dafydd in 2000, followed by Sh Ch Coedybrain Carys at Typica (owned by Jan & Alan Rees). Next came Sh Ch Coedybrain Nelli who produced Sh Ch Coedybrain Nia at Cwnbeili (owned by Karen Lancett).

My love of Cocker Spaniels comes from my Brother in Law Roly Webb (Speechouse affix) and have always had a soft spot for them and I am on the b list to judge them. I also served on the South Wales & Monmouth Cocker Spaniel Club committee. I have judge WSS several times at CH show level in the UK and also judged the breed in Finland and Sweden.

I have judged Gundogs on many occasions since my first appointment in 1979 and the Group on several occasions. I have also judge BIS at an all breeds show. I feel privileged to have been born in an area blessed with many great WSS kennels and learned a great deal from my visits to Pencelli, Tregwilym and Dalati kennels. Advice I received has stayed with me over the years and has helped shape my appreciation of the breed type. I would like to thank your committee for their invitation to judge at their show and look forward to the day.

GER PHILPOTT – Caspar

I am an experienced conformation judge and grew up in a household with animals including Border Collie dogs. Aged 13 I acquired my first show dog, a Scottish Terrier. I fulfilled a life long ambition and desire to own a Weimaraner in the early 1990's and since then, under my Caspar affix, I have bred, campaigned and finished many Show Champion Weimaraners. I have also campaigned Slovakian Wire-Haired Pointers, Korthals Griffon and Wire Haired Pointing dogs to their international titles. I look forward to campaigning a Hungarian Wire Haired Vizsla in 2023. I have a particular interest in the Continental HPR breeds. I am the Secretary of Dun Laoghaire & Monkstown Canine Society, one of Ireland's oldest and most respected Canine Societies. A Best-in-Show judge, I am licenced internationally to judge all FCI Group 3, Group 4, Group 7, Group 8 and Group 10 Breeds at CAC and CACIB levels.

I have served on several Irish Kennel Club (IKC) committees, including The Top Irish Show Dog and An Ard Comhairle the IKC's governing body. I have served on several Breed Club committees in Ireland including the Spinoni Club of Ireland and was a founder member of the All Ireland HPR Gundog Club. I have been active in working trials and field trials. I award CC's in Weimaraners and Cockers in the UK. I judge Gundogs and terriers breeds and groups frequently at open show level throughout the UK.

KAREN LANCETT - Cwmbeili

I started showing my first WSS bitch Bronwyn (Highmere Martha) in 2002. I subsequently purchased Coedybrain Nia from Jan & Barrie Janes in 2013 and she gained her SH CH title in August 2018. I currently show Nia and her daughter Cwmbeili Madlan and I am a committee member of The WSS Club of South Wales. I have passed all of my judging seminars. Most recently I have passed all necessary qualifications to move me up to JEP level 2 for Labrador Retrievers which I have always had a love of, having showed them for friends for many years. I first had the pleasure of judging Welshies at Windsor Gundog Society open show in October 2018. I judged Welshies again in April 2019 at Pontypool & D C S, WSS dogs at your show on 21st September 2019. I am looking forward to coming back again to judge some more spaniel breed classes again and very excited to be judging Labradors.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **2nd August**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F(1)19.

(2) Transfer a. If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b. For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed,

colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c. For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d. If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY - For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY - For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR - For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING - For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL YEARLING - For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT - For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN - For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN - For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN - For dogs of 10 And over years.

SPECIAL CHAMPION - For dogs which have become a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club – dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

BRACE - For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace.

GOOD CITIZEN DOG SCHEME - For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above.

SHOW CERTIFICATE OF MERIT or SHOW CERTIFICATE OF EXCELLENCE - For dogs which have been confirmed a Show Certificate of Merit or Show Certificate of Excellence winner

- dogs must compete in breed or AVNSC classes to be eligible for Best in Show.

SPECIAL WORKING GUNDOG - For dogs which have won prizes and awards in recognised competition at Gundog Working Test or having gained their Show Gundog Qualifier or a Gundog Working Certificate.

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER - For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by The Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant. Such breeds may be entered into Imported Breed Register classes and/or Any Variety or Stakes classes, with the exception of **AVNSC** classes, for which they are not eligible.

NATIVE VULNERABLE BREEDS - For gundog breeds as per Kennel Clubs yearly list.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 8.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.00 am.
4. The show will be unbenched. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves within the confines of the show is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.

6. **MEMBERSHIP** - £3.00 Single - £4.00 Joint - £1.00 Junior

Entry fees per dog per class - £3.00 Members - £4.50 Non-Members – NFC Free. Make all cheques or postal orders payable to "Cornwall Gundog Club" or Bank Transfer quoting Name and Breed, e mail secretary for bank details. **Catalogues** £3.00 with entries.

Catalogue advertisements: £5.00 full page or £3.00 half page – copy with entry subject to space available. **Class Rosettes:** £3.00 a set. **Special Rosettes:** £2.50 each for BOB – RBOB – BOS – BPIB - BVIB only.

7. Prize money on offer at this show is: BIS - £20, RBIS - £15, 3rd BIS - £10, 4th BIS - £5. BPIS - £20, RBPIS - £15, 3rd BPIS - £10, 4th BPIS - £5. BVIS - ££15, RBVIS - £10. Best RBOBIS - £15.
8. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
11. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy

is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.

12. Best in Show

The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

Best of Breed - Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and The Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

18. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

19. Not for Competition: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B) 1.

These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42. 2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition. 3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except: (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee. (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed. (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive. 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis. 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same

breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf. 6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING IDENTIFICATION OF DOGS

It is a Kennel Club requirement that exhibitors display the exhibit number on their crate, cage or container at all times.

This is particularly important when cages etc. are not on benches, and at unbenched shows.

Each exhibitor is responsible for providing their own cage identification and should note that the original exhibit/bench number card, as provided by the show society, must not be used for this purpose.

It is important to be able to contact exhibitors and identify dogs where a dog may be in distress or where the crate might be blocking a gangway.
