## ABOUT OUR JUDGES

### ***MRS SHARON ADAMS – Tillarn***

I got my first dog in 1988, a blue roan Cocker Spaniel bitch. After starting off in Obedience I very quickly got drawn into the world of dog showing. After a few years of attending my local ringcraft was asked to join the committee where I held various offices but mainly Chief Steward & show Manager. I also ran the ringcraft & was assistant treasurer. I joined my local breed club where I was Health & Welfare Officer & ran the club shop. In 2005 I added English Toy Terriers to our household & a couple of years later joined the breed club committee where I was Seminar Secretary & Health Officer. **DOGS IN CARS:** Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in cars being found in a distressed condition in accordance with Kennel Club guidelines

### DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must be at the time of entry a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **10<sup>th</sup> April, 2019**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1: Withdrawal – The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

2: Transfer:

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior Or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**KENNEL CLUB CHALLENGE CERTIFICATE WINNERS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SHOW**

**PUPPY** – For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

**JUNIOR** – For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

**GRADUATE** – For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** - For dogs which have not won seven or more First Prizes in all, at Open and Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not.

**OPEN** – For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

**SPECIAL VETERAN** – 7 to 9 years - For dogs of not less than seven years of age and has not attained its tenth birthday on the first day of the show.

**SPECIAL VETERAN** – 10 years & over - For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the show

**ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED** – For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

**IMPORTED BREED REGISTER** – For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant.

**GOOD CITIZEN SCHEME STAKES** – For a dog that has achieved a GCDS Bronze award certificate or above.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1:** The show will open at 9.00 am.
- 2:** Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3:** Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
- 4:** The show will be unbenched. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5:** The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6:** Entry fees: Members - £3.50 - Stakes Class - £3.50  
Membership: Single £4.00 - Joint £5.00 – Junior £1.50 – Due 1<sup>st</sup> January annually.  
Catalogues - £3.00 prepaid with entries  
Advertisements - £5 full page & £2.50 half a page.
- 7:** Prize money: £10 for BIS & BVIS – Stakes classes 99 & 100: 1<sup>st</sup> - £10, 2<sup>nd</sup> - £5, 3<sup>rd</sup> - £3, 4<sup>th</sup> - £2 presented by Penzance & DCS
- 8:** The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9:** Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10:** The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11. Best Puppy in Show**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group

or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.

1) Best Puppy in Group and subsequent placings must be selected from those puppies which have been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy.

2) Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners.

### **12. Best in Show**

The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

1) Best of Breed - Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

2) Best of Group - Best of group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:-

a) - The Best of Breed winners in each group.

b) - The Best dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.

c) - The Best dog from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group.

### **13) - Best in Show**

Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.

**14.** Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the last announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

**15.** Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

**16.** All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

**17.** All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

### **16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

*Show Schedule Notice to be reproduced. (See Annex A to Schedule).*

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example, a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put as dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

**Right to refuse entries.** Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

**17. Not for Competition:**

Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered or

**19:** Exhibit numbers must be displayed on all cages and crates.

**20:** Except when securely benched or caged Dogs must be on a lead for the duration of the show including the exercise area.

**21:** Exhibitors who bring children to the venue will be held totally responsible for any damage the Children do whilst at the show.

## **SOFT CRATES**

The Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health & safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside. We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.


